Pastor: After the resurrection of Jesus, Peter and the apostles boldly proclaimed the risen Lord but never failed to confront sin. Our sin mocks the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, so we are challenged to look at our sin honestly and confess to God.

## ***The First Reading***

**Acts 3:11-21 NIRV**

<sup>11</sup>The man was holding on to Peter and John. All the people were amazed. They came running to them at the place called Solomon's Porch. <sup>12</sup>When Peter saw this, he said, "Fellow Israelites, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us? It's not as if we've made this man walk by our own power or godliness. <sup>13</sup>The God of our fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, has done this. God has brought glory to Jesus, who serves him. But you handed Jesus over to be killed. Pilate had decided to let him go. But you spoke against Jesus when he was in Pilate's court. <sup>14</sup>You spoke against the Holy and Blameless One. You asked for a murderer to be set free instead. <sup>15</sup>You killed the one who gives life. But God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. <sup>16</sup>This man whom you see and know was made strong because of faith in Jesus' name. Faith in Jesus has healed him completely. You can see it with your own eyes.

<sup>17</sup>“My fellow Israelites, I know you didn’t realize what you were doing. Neither did your leaders. <sup>18</sup>But God had given a promise through all the prophets. And this is how he has made his promise come true. He said that his Messiah would suffer. <sup>19</sup>So turn away from your sins. Turn to God. Then your sins will be wiped away. The time will come when the Lord will make everything new. <sup>20</sup>He will send the Messiah. Jesus has been appointed as the Messiah for you. <sup>21</sup>Heaven must receive him until the time when God makes everything new. He promised this long ago through his holy prophets.

## ***The Second Reading***

### ***Luke 24:36-49 NIRV***

<sup>36</sup>The disciples were still talking about this when Jesus himself suddenly stood among them. He said, “May you have peace!”

<sup>37</sup>They were surprised and terrified. They thought they were seeing a ghost. <sup>38</sup>Jesus said to them, “Why are you troubled? Why do you have doubts in your minds? <sup>39</sup>Look at my hands and my feet. It’s really me! Touch me and see. A ghost does not have a body or bones. But you can see that I do.”

<sup>40</sup>After he said that, he showed them his hands and feet. <sup>41</sup>But they still did not believe it. They were amazed and filled with joy. So Jesus asked them, “Do you have anything here to eat?” <sup>42</sup>They gave him a piece of cooked fish. <sup>43</sup>He took it and ate it in front of them.

**Mark 7:31-37 NIRV**

<sup>31</sup>Then Jesus left the area of Tyre and went through Sidon. He went down to the Sea of Galilee and into the area known as the Ten Cities. <sup>32</sup>There some people brought a man to Jesus. The man was deaf and could hardly speak. They begged Jesus to place his hand on the man.

<sup>33</sup>Jesus took the man to one side, away from the crowd. He put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. <sup>34</sup>Jesus looked up to heaven. With a deep sigh, he said to the man, "*Ephphatha!*" That means "Be opened!" <sup>35</sup>The man's ears were opened. His tongue was freed up, and he began to speak clearly.

<sup>36</sup>Jesus ordered the people not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. <sup>37</sup>People were really amazed. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes deaf people able to hear. And he makes those who can't speak able to talk."
